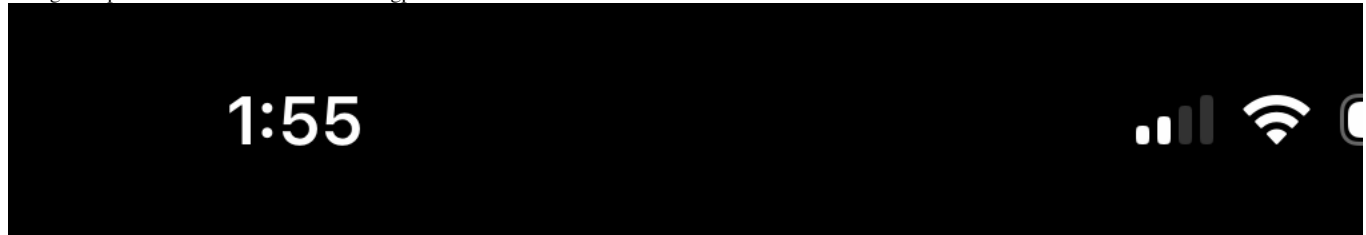

Thank you for your interest in the Dispute Resolution Center of King County (KCDRC) family mediation services.

This is to confirm that I've been assigned as your KCDRC family mediation services case manager. (My contact info is below.)

When you've carefully reviewed all of the following info, please contact me by reply email to let me know:

- > that you'd like to proceed to the next step of scheduling a **phone intake appointment**, which will include more detailed info on KCDRC family mediation options for your situation (including specific fees amounts);
- > or that KCDRC services wouldn't be applicable for your situation at this time.

As a nonprofit Dispute Resolution Center, our family mediation services are provided on a sliding fee scale, with each party (or each set of parties representing a side in the dispute) typically paying between \$200 and \$600 based on their household income. The party who initiates the mediation case pays a nonrefundable deposit that can be applied toward their fees amount. These fees generally cover KCDRC services through a first mediation session; family mediation sessions are scheduled for a 3-hour timeframe. Additional fees apply for further mediation sessions, and also may apply in certain other circumstances.

During mediation, KCDRC focuses on the facilitative approach which emphasizes parties speaking directly to each other with mediator support (rather than the shuttle format with parties separated from each other). KCDRC family mediation sessions currently are held virtually (via zoom). Mediation sessions conducted through KCDRC are recognized by King County courts as meeting pre-trial alternative dispute resolution requirements for a wide range of family matters (including divorces/dissolutions & parenting plans).

Please note that participating in services through KCDRC is voluntary and KCDRC is not an enforcement agency. KCDRC does not provide:

- legal advice or assistance including with court forms/filings;
- professional services not directly related to dispute resolution (such as therapy/counseling or financial advice);
- mediation services regarding child support;
- mediation services when there's a recent no contact/protection order between the parties (or in other similar situations depending on the specific circumstances).

Please also note KCDRC is not providing express mediation services at this time; our family mediation sessions typically are scheduled for about three to four weeks *after* all parties have completed initial intake and applicable fees have been paid (depending on scheduling availability of participants & mediators).
