3. Active Duty Military

*The **federal** Servicemembers Civil Relief Act covers:*

7. Restraining Order

[X] The Court already signed a short-term DVPO on 4/25/25 under King County Case #25-2-11308-6 SEA just to give the Protected Person, Mathew Ralidak, time to schedule a Modification Order in this case.

[X] **Do not disturb** – Do not disturb my peace or the peace of any child listed in 2.

[X] **Stay away** – Do not go onto the grounds of or enter my home, workplace, vehicle, or school, or the daycare or school of any child listed in 2.

[X] Also, do not knowingly go or stay within 1,000 feet of my home, workplace, vehicle, or school, or the daycare or school of any child listed in **2**.

Warning! If the court makes this order and the parties are intimate partners, the court must consider if weapons restrictions are required by state law; federal law may also prohibit the Restrained Person from possessing firearms or ammunition.

[X] **No Contact:** Do not attempt or have any contact, including nonphysical contact, directly, indirectly, or through third parties, regardless of whether those third parties know of the order with the protected person/Respondent or member of the protected person's household, Monica Galarneau, except for service of court documents.

The court granted the Father/Respondent a short-term DVPO after a full hearing under #25-2-11308-6 SEA with order to file a modification in the family law case. *See Decl. of Ralidak, Ex. A.*

Father asks the court to grant him a restraining order in this case with the same provisions in the DVPO, King County Case #25-2-11308-6 SEA, to consolidate the issues which the family law court is better suited to determine.

8. Other Temporary Orders

- a. Mother will telephonic/video contact with the children through Talking Parents only. Father must allow children and Mother to communicate telephonically at least once a day.

- b. Mother may not cancel any appointments the Father makes for the children as allowed under the current parenting plan. Mother may not attend the parenting classes regarding ADHD through Children's Hospital that the Father waited 7 months to get accepted to and paid for.
- c. No person who has a protection order against them by either parent, may have access to or be listed in the children's health records or MyChart account.


